

2015 Element Card Requirements

- Create an element card. You may do this on the 2015 Element Card document in the Google Classroom or on a sheet of blank paper.
- Below is the specific information that you will need on page 1 and page 2 of the Classroom document or on the front and back of your card if you use a blank sheet of paper.
- Use your Chromebook for research and inserting images. If you can't find some of the information below, choose another element.
- See my Neon Element Card example in the classroom. You may not use Neon as your element.

Card Criteria:

On page 1 or the **FRONT** of your element card:

- Element name
- The chemical symbol – big and bold
- A visual image of the element in color (it can be inserted as a url in images on the Chromebook document, or hand draw on blank paper. If you use blank paper and want to print an image out and glue it on your paper, you will have to print at home.

On page 2 or the **BACK** of your element card:

- The name of your element
- Atomic Number
- Atomic Mass
- Number of Protons
- Number of Neutrons
- Number of Electrons
- Discovered by: (sometimes this is unknown)
- Discovery date: (sometimes this is unknown)
- 2 Important Uses
- Your name
- Feel free to add additional images to make a nice looking document

Inserting images on a Chromebook document: (You may have a better way of inserting images, but this worked for me)

Find an image. I like to go to Google images.

Using two fingers press on the touch pad until you get the menu.

Click on Copy image URL

Go back to your Element document

Find the spot where you want to put your image.

Click on Insert.

Click on Image

Click on By URL

Control V

Click on Select and your image should appear
